

ARTICLE 5.400. BURNING REGULATIONS

(a) It shall hereafter be unlawful and constitute a misdemeanor for any person, firm, or corporation to burn any substance in the city limits of the City of Trinity when weather conditions are such that fire is likely to spread from such burning substance to grass, weeds, buildings, improvements, or other materials situated on property belonging to another person, firm, or corporation.

(b) It shall hereafter be unlawful and constitute a misdemeanor for any person, firm, or corporation to intentionally or negligently set fire to grass, weeds, buildings, improvements, or other materials situated on premises belonging to another person, firm, or corporation.

(c) The fact that a fire knowingly and intentionally started by any person, firm, or corporation has spread to grass, weeds, buildings, improvements, or other materials situated on premises belonging to another person, firm, or corporation, shall be deemed prima-facie evidence of negligence under the terms and provisions of this section.

(d) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation, or organization to burn refuse or material of any kind within the fire district except in a city approved incinerator.
